HISTORY OF WOMEN'S DIVISION

In 1969 there existed a Beautification Committee of the Chamber of Commerce. Five Women, who each month went out and selected beauty spots in the county and made awards.

Also in 1969 in the Commissioners' Court Minutes, we find that the Beautification Committee received court approval for the fountain in the Courthouse Square. The County would provide water and electricity and the Beautification Committee

provide maintenance and upkeep. Failure to do so would then revert the fountain to the country.

The Women's Division was born on March 5, 1972 with seventeen (17) ladies present. With this birth, the Beautification Committee of the Chamber of Commerce ceased to Exist and we assumed all responsibility for beautification to include the fountain.

Mrs. Dan Auld, Sr., was our first President. Mr. Bill Dozier of the Kerrville Daily times was then President of the Chamber of Commerce. Ed Phelps was Executive Vice President of the Chamber of Commerce and was a prime mover to establish this organization.

The Women's Division is a selfless group, individually and collectively for people who love Kerr Country and who want to be a part of the Women's Division and of the total Chamber of Commerce

You are invited and urged to lead in a selfless way. It is, from its' creation, a service organization-a selfless organization. It is made up of women who are concerned. No discriminations. The Women's Division is for those who love Kerr Country. It is a service organization and it must select achievable community projects.

"We must not rely on namby-pamby little Sunday School type projects. We must pick out big projects. It is high time the Women's Division collectively be more dynamic 'right now' here, today. Get started right now. We need gumption. 'Gumption' is where you separate the women from the girls. Start today by jumping in. Go ahead and do it."

And "go ahead" we did. Here is part of the record:

At our second meeting April 5, 1972, "Operation Brilliante" was born-a big beautification program for Kerr County. Clean up-clean it all up. Everybody present chaired one or more committees to clean up. Initially we wanted to clean up Ingram Dam, put decent trash containers on our downtown streets, and get a museum established.

At our third meeting on May 3, 1972, Mrs. Ruthe Jackson from Grand Prairie, Texas, an enthusiast in Texas beautification-fired us all up.

We did not meet that summer so the fire died down.

On Sept. 7, 1972 the Green Capers took over from the Green Coat Kerr Kountrymen of the Chamber of Commerce. We got our capes later and you will note that there are no horns on our deers.

In December 1972 the Women's Division participated in the Hill Country Arts Foundation Christmas show. The theme was "A Children's Christmas Tree." We had the tree; but, no ornaments. So a few of us got busy for two (2) days and a night using nylon net and foil and made a satisfactory showing.

About that time, we had lost our Treasurer; our President resigned and left town; Vice-President and the Secretary were trying to quit; but, couldn't find anybody to take our resignations, so we hung in.

In January 1973, we began major landscaping of the Chamber of Commerce grounds at the new building. It has been major-landscaped at least four (4) times since then.

Some of the things we've done:

Mrs. Zelma Hardy, Mayor of Kerrville was a member of the Women's Division.

She wanted the benches in the courthouse square painted. Several of us joined her and painted.

Stock Show in San Antonio

Competitions to select a Kerr County Queen, Miss Pecan Queen, etc.

Outstanding Woman of the Month and of the Year

Outstanding Young Woman

Chamber of Commerce Float cleaned up and put in parades-thank goodness it has been sold.

Home Furnishing Shows

Texas Arts & Crafts Fair selling our cookbooks. The books arrived late the night Before the Fair opened and the driver was drunk as a skunk-but we got the books to the Fair on time.

Our President is an accepted Director of the Executive Committee of the Chamber of Commerce.

Our women have distinguished themselves in many other projects in other organizations in our community, and we are proud of you.

For the Bicentennial in 1976, we sold flags to raise money to print our Historic Cookbook which is now a collector's item. One of our members did all the art work Our then President Naida Garvin created the logo approved for the Hill Country Bicentennial Commission.

We made speeches on flag history

Assisted our Hill Country Beautification Committee in many ways, individually.

This was a part of the application to the Beautify Texas Council for the Janey Briscoe Certificate awarded to us in San Antonio, Texas, in June 1976. This certificate is presently in the Time Capsule in the Courthouse.

Reprinted our cookbook and three more Christmas In The Hills cookbooks.

Two of our members were riding back from the Beautify Texas Council's June meeting in San Antonio and one jokingly said to the other, "Why don't we try for the big award?" From this joke the Women's Division organized PIK-Pride In Kerrville beautification effort. So for six (6) months we worked like Trojans, and applied for

the award. In June 1977 at El Paso, Texas the Women's Division received the Governor's Community Achievement Award for our population category-there were six categories of population. On top of that, the Women's Division won the Award of Excellence-the best of all categories. This Silver Bowl resides in a lovely cabinet in the Butt Holdsworth Memorial Library. The cabinet donated by one of our members.

In 1978 we reorganized for PIK-PIK-People in Kerr have Pride in Kerr and applied again. This was the time when the flood was on us. At Houston in June 1979, the Women's Division received the Governor's Certificate of Recognition. This was for our clean-up in 1978. We were in a three way tie for first place. Christmas In The Hills was born in this beautification effort.

In June 1980 the Women's Division hosted the annual meeting of the Beautify Texas Council, here in Kerrville. A tremendous effort and it was beautifully done. The Women's Division brought in Lady Senior Citizen Award for Lee Phillips; the Kerrville Young Sprouts Garden Club received a Special Youth Award; Cypress Creek 4-H Club was a runner-up in Youth Awards. (They had won first place in Houston for 4-H. Best in the State); and Linda Tate won the valuable Bluebonnet Award.

The Christmas in the Hills has now established itself securely. Following are the responsibilities of this committee:

Promote and spread goodwill and cheer in the Kerrville area.

Plan calendar for December for the community.

Aid the Convention and Visitors Bureau in promoting tourism in the Kerrville area during December.

Aid other organizations in promoting projects for Christmas in The Hills. Manage and coordinate such projects as may be approved by the Board. Submit annual reports from each chairman within the committee in triplicate. Include fund raising events that: (a) encourage community participation in Christmas events (such as Christmas Style Show, Mistletoe Ball, etc.) (b) support non-functioning community Christmas events (such as, Christmas Tree Forest, Children's Poster/mural, & Outdoor Decorating Contests.)

Act as advisors for the subsequent Christmas in the Hills project.

It has taken a lot of dedicated hard-working people doing a lot of hard work and long hours. We did not get to this Twelve Birthday without a struggle. We have known joy and sorrow; laughter and tears; success and frustration; love and hate; a miracle or two; despite our frailties, we have a successful, progressive Women's Division, and money in the bank.

The challenge is still there. There are things to be done and women who are willing to do them. Let's get on with it!

Cloth Bags for Female patients at VA


Original cloth size: 44" x 12". Also need 37" yarn or heavy string and 2 buttons.

Iron cloth flat. Fold lengthwise with right sides facing and sew right side from top to bottom. Sew left side from bottom to 14 inches from the top; stop.

To create an opening on the left side, fold under remaining 7-8" on left side along seam line and sew each fold line from previous stopping point to the top on both sides of seam. Backstitch along the bottom split.

Fold top selvage down inside bag 2" all the way around the top from back left side to front left side; iron flat; do this again so there are two 2" folds. Iron flat. Sew the fold three times: 1/4" from top; 1" from top; 2" from top. Backstitch all ends.

Size should now be 18-18.5" long and 11" wide.



Use safety pin to pull 37" yarn or heavy string through middle casing line from left front to left back. Thread each end of yarn through a large button and tie end securely under each button. Sew 1/2" seam along bottom of bag for added strength and to shorten the length slightly. Finished!
