our face and name out in the community and I urge you to join us. If you want to volunteer contact Mary Sue Douville about our upcoming events.



Dub Haney — Life's Treasure, awarded posthumously

There are people who seldom look beyond what benefits themselves — whether in terms of time, happiness or financial gain — and then there are those who think only of others.

George Wyatt "Dub" Haney was the latter.

Haney, who died May 4, 2017, at the age of 89, garnered the respect of the communities in which he lived and left behind a legacy of kindness that will not be forgotten.

For his service to others, Haney was selected as a recipient of the 2017 Life's Treasures award.

Sponsored by The Kerrville Daily Times and the Dietert Center, the award honors individuals who work to improve the community and the lives of others through a lifetime of achievement, creativity or service.

"The thing that I always heard was Dub self-lessly gave to the community." said Walf Koenig, president and CDO of the Kerville Area Chamber of Commerce. "He was the kind of guy who was always first to arrive and last to leave when work was to be done. He simply didn't know the word "no." I knew him during the twilight of his life and, even during his last days, he was engaged and involved. He inspired many, including myself."

A son of the Lone Star state, Haney's lifetime of service began at an early age, when he, like many young men at the time, answered the call to arms in one of our nation's darkest hours.

Serving in the U.S. Navy during World War II, he was sent to San Diego, California, and was assigned to Balboa Naval Hospital to support wounded airmen and other personnel.

Ever a patriot, Haney exercised his right to vote in every election in an effort to ensure that the voice of the people would not be diminished by apathy.

He and his wife, May, who died in 1954, moved to Mountain Home, where he accepted a position as postmaster. He remarried in 1957 and continued to serve as postmaster for that community for 23 years.

"I remember my Dad telling me that, while at the Mountain Home Post Office during the Christmas season, if all of the packages had not been picked up on that last working day before Christmas, he would do his best to get them delivered to the recipient, so the gift would be there in time for Christmas," said Joan Salsbury, Haney's daughter.

At the time, Mountain Home's mail route extended more than 200 miles. Haney also was in charge of a substation on Prade Ranch. During his tenure as postmaster, Haney witnessed the advent of the five-digit ZIP codes and the evolution of the Post Office Department to the U.S.

"If someone had a loved one overseas, and a letter or package was received, he would call the recipient to make sure they knew they had something from their loved one," Salsbury said of her father.

His kindnesses and dedication did not go unnoticed, and his reputation as a good man was solidified.

Haney went on to serve for four years as the postmaster in Ingram and six years in Comfort, before retiring after a total of 33 years in the federal mail service.

Salsbury said her father gave her memorabilia from his early days as postmaster, "and they are meaningful keepsakes for me."

Following retirement, Haney moved to the private sector in a variety of fields, but always in a capacity that enabled him to work with people.

"Through the years, Dub had made many friends — all throughout the community," said Craig Salsbury, Haney's son-in-law. "Two of the things Dub was best known for were his big hugs and also his strong handshakes."

Haney's commitment to service to others was rooted in the tenets of his Christian faith. Throughout the years, he and his second wife, Raye, who also preceded him in death, were members of Sunset Baptist Church, First Baptist Church — where he was a deacon and deacon emeritus — and Trinity Baptist Church.

He was active in the brotherhood at Sunset and First Baptist churches, and was a director and trustee of the nondenominational Hill Country Cowboy Camp Meeting.

A 40-plus-year member of the Rotary Club of Kerrville, Haney personfied the oganization is motto of "Service Above Self." Through his generosity and membership, he was honored with a Paul Harris Fellowship. The award, named for the founder of the 1.2-million-member Rotary International service organization, recognizes those individuals who are sterling advocates of the rotary's goals of world peace and international understanding.

Haney also served on the Ingram PTA, was a volunteer firefighter in the Mountain Home Volunteer Fire Department, was active in the Hunt-Ingram Lions Club, held a position in every office in the Texas chapter of the National Association of Postmasters of the United States, volunteered at the Texas State Arts and Crafts Fair, and was named an ambassador of the Kerrville Area Chamber of Commerce.

It was in service to the chamber that he and Raye were named Co-Citizens of the Year in 1996. A decade later, the couple was honored as co-lifetime members of the Kerrville Area Cham-











ber of Commerce.

The Haneys had joined the chamber on Feb. 28, 1980, and on that date during a dedication ceremony this past year, Feb. 28 was declared by the chamber as Dub and Raye Haney Day. A plaque in the Haneys' honor now hangs on a wall in the lobby of the chamber's office. In all, Haney was an active member of the chamber for more than 36 consecutive years.

Last September, he was recognized as the only individual member of the Kerrville Area Chamber of Commerce to attain 35plus years. All other memberships in that category were businesses.

"In a lifetime, one meets thousands of

people, and I have been blessed to meet some of the best." Koenig said. "Dub encouraged me and inspired me. He still does I'm sure that I'm one of thousands that he touched. He is a man that I will never forget."

Haney is survived by daughters, Gayle Haney and Joan Balsbury and husband, Craig; granddaughter, Kate Balsbury and fi-ance, Gavin Rieke; sister, Geraldine Haney Voelter, of Bugar Land; brother, Jack Haney and wife, Mary Helen, of Huntsville; niece, Pat Angell and husband, Jim; sister-in-law, Joraine and brother-in-law, Jim Haynie of Mountain Home; Busie Hey; and numerous nieces, nephews, Jamily and friends.

Cloth Bags for Female patients at VA


Original cloth size: 44" x 12". Also need 37" yarn or heavy string and 2 buttons.

Iron cloth flat. Fold lengthwise with right sides facing and sew right side from top to bottom. Sew left side from bottom to 14 inches from the top; stop.


To create an opening on the left side, fold under remaining 7-8" on left side along seam line and sew each fold line from previous stopping point to the top on both sides of seam. Backstitch along the bottom split.

Fold top selvage down inside bag 2" all the way around the top from back left side to front left side; iron flat; do this again so there are two 2" folds. Iron flat. Sew the fold three times: 1/4" from top; 1" from top; 2" from top. Backstitch all ends.

Size should now be 18-18.5" long and 11" wide.



Use safety pin to pull 37" yarn or heavy string through middle casing line from left front to left back. Thread each end of yarn through a large button and tie end securely under each button. Sew 1/2" seam along bottom of bag for added strength and to shorten the length slightly. Finished!

BEAUTIFICATION:	Selects monthly recipients of the Beautification Award, develops plans for KCWC beautification projects in our community, represents KCWC at patriotic events and ceremonies such as Veterans Day and Memorial Day.
MEMBERSHIP & HOSPITALITY:	Promotes membership expansion through the encouragement of renewals and recruitment of new members. Arranges for new member name badge/t-shirts and promotes involvement of new members. Hospitality committee greets members at the door each meeting and hands out door prize tickets for attendance and wearing name badges to meetings. Also handles collection of door prizes for monthly drawings.
WAYS & MEANS:	Develops and organizes events and fund raising projects other than Special Events, as approved by the membership in order to fund the KCWC community projects and Women Helping Women Scholarships Program.
OUTSTANDING WOMAN AWARD:	Distributes and collects applications in July and August; arranges for Applications to be judged so winner is determined in time for presentation at the Annual Chamber of Commerce Banquet in September; has a plaque prepared for presentation by KCWC President.
PROPERTY:	Keep inventory of all KCWC property; be responsible for loan and return of all such property; responsible for securing and maintaining rental storage facilities.
CHRISTMAS LIGHTING:	Responsible for the Christmas lighting program at Tranquility Island or any other Christmas lighting project that the Corporation may vote to sponsor; aid other organizations in promoting projects for "Christmas in the Hills"; manage and coordinate such projects as may be approved by the Board.
SCHOLARSHIPS:	Distribute applications to women in the Kerr County area who wish to further their career thru education, promoting the Women Helping Women Scholarship Program. Responsible for publicity, determine worthy recipients, and make arrangements to introduce the scholarship winners at the general meeting.

GOODWILL:	Responsible for sending cards to members in hospital, make monetary memorials on death of immediate family members. Announce birthdays for the month at each meeting.
VOLUNTEERS TO GO	Volunteers to Go assists other civic organizations with events needing help as requested.
TELEPHONE COMMITTEE:	Call board members and general members to take reservation for meetings; obtain a current membership list from the Membership Committee monthly; inform the luncheon host of total number of reservations for each meeting; provide a reservation list of members and guests to the Treasurer before each meeting; call members for special events or notices as requested by the Board.
PUBLICITY:	Responsible for the releases to the news media, insuring that they are timely, accurate and in the interest of the Corporation; Present notices of all meetings and events to the news media in time for the monthly Calendar of Events, including date, time and place of meetings, the agenda and an invitation to all interested to attend. Present follow up articles to the news media; arrange for reporters and/or photographers to be present at significant Corporation events; assist all committees with publicity campaigns.
WELCOME/RIBBON CUTTING:	Serve as official representative of the Corporation at special events upon request; attend all business grand openings or see that the Corporation is represented by one of our members; invite new business owners to introduce their business at general membership meeting; report new business to the Board and general membership monthly, keeping adequate records for the annual report.
YEARBOOK:	Responsible for updating the membership directory and issuing changes to the membership.
NEWSLETTER/WEBSITE:	Shall prepare a Newsletter for distribution at each regular meeting to include birthdays, illnesses, grand openings, new member introductions, special events (both upcoming and after the fact) and any other newsworthy items to keep membership informed. Chair to oversee the website design and maintenance.
BYLAWS:	Responsible for updating the By-laws and shall be chaired by the Parliamentarian.
HOSTESS:	Make arrangements for luncheons and special meetings of the Corporation; be responsible for hostesses to greet members and visitors at meetings; plan and implement decorations for regular and special meetings of the Corporation.
DELI PROGRAM:	Collect food and cash donations provided by members at the monthly membership meetings. Deliver items to the designated food bank. Shop for food bank items needed using cash donations.
RECYCLING COMMITTEE:	Collect ink cartridges for recycle. Deliver ink cartridges to recycling location. Funds received for the ink cartridges are given to the charity of the committee's choice.
