# Chamber banquet honors 'Outstanding Woman'

Eight Kerrville area community leaders were celebrated with awards at the 92nd Annual Chamber Banquet on Sept. 18, with the husband / wife duo of Tim and Mary Ellen Summerlin named "Citizens of the Year" for 2014.

#### **Outstanding Woman of the Year**

Speck was described by last year's winner Rose Bradshaw not tooting her own horn, but preferring to do everything behind the scenes. She is a real giver not only to her family, but to any task she places in her hands, Bradshaw said.

"As her three children grew up in Kerrville, she was involved with those tasks that involve us all in our children's lives, but she did not stop there. She served on numerous boards in school and in fundraising activities," she said.

Linda Speck's resume includes, chairman and co-founder of the ACS Huntsmans Ball in 1984, past president of ACS in Kerrville, president of Starkey PTO where she chaired the Sausage Supper, Art Days and many other committees; board member of Tivy Upper Elem PTO and chair of its Taco Supper fund raiser, Tivy Project Graduation Prize Committee chairperson for three years; and president of the Kerr, Kimble, Gillespie, Bandera Medical Auxiliary.

"Her biggest accomplishment is our Hill Country Soccer program. If you have ever had a child or grandchild in this program, you have seen the work this woman has laid out," Bradshaw said.

"By helping get the over \$200,000 in funding to make the complex in 1995, her 25-plus years of service to Hill Country Youth Soccer has touched many, many children's lives. Her dedication to the program, even after her children left the program, sums up how this giver deserves this award. Here's to 'Mama Speck' (the name given by her children's friends because she was always there for them and fed them well)."

"I'm flattered and honored. It's a privilege to serve the children," Speck said.



Winners were honored on Sept. 6 during the annual national conference held this year in Greenville, S.C. All first place entries in the Press Women of Texas state contest compete in the NFPW Communications Contest where awards were presented during a banquet in Greenville.

Bonnie Arnold won the following national awards: honorable mention, news story; second, feature story; honorable mention, specialty articles - education; second, specialty articles - social issues, and honorable mention, specialty articles - travel.

Some of the judges' comments about Bonnie's work include:

Packed with useful information, they were perfectly targeted to the community newspaper audience."
