








Tranquility Island - Christmas Lighting

The Women's Division of the Kerrville Chamber of Commerce was organized in 1972 to support and initiate projects for the improvement of our community. Kerrville's population was approximately 12,000 people and business in our community was limited.

Under the direction and leadership of Pat Auld, the Women's Division, a group of about 25 women assisted in:

- Answering phones for the Chamber
- ★ Initiating beautification projects
- Assisting with mortgage payments for the Chamber, when needed

Through the years, the Women's Division:

- ★ Sponsored numerous beautification projects
- Organized fundraising
- Supported new businesses
- Assisted with conventions

In 1998, with a growing membership, the Women's Division filed and reorganized as a 501C-3 entity and chose the name of Kerr County Women's Chamber, Inc.

Our organization continues to grow today and has expanded fundraising to assist in more philanthropic and community needs. Current endeavors include:

Christmas lighting at Tranquility Park

- * Collecting school supplies for children in need
- ★ Initiating beautification projects
- Awarding a monthly Beautification Award for individuals and businesses
- ★ Planting trees on Arbor Day
- * Attending all new business ribbon cuttings
- ★ Supplying numerous volunteers for community events
- ★ Assisting CAM through our Deli Program
- ★ Participating in various recycling programs
- Supporting Christian Women's Job Corp through volunteers and mentoring students
- ★ Hosting the yearly Veteran Appreciation Day Lunch
- ★ Selecting an "Outstanding Woman" each year
- ★ Assisting in "Wreaths Across America" recognizing veteran's graves
- ★ Awarding scholarships through the "Women Helping Women Scholarship Program"

Since the organization of Kerr County Women's Chamber, our organization has awarded over \$120,000 to women meeting the requirements in advancing their careers through higher education.
