SHARE FAVORITE RECIPES AND QUOTES

FISH TACOS

Line a large baking sheet with parchment or silicone liner. In a small dish, stir together seasonings: 1/2 tsp cumin 1/2 tsp cayenne pepper 1 tsp salt 1/4 tsp black pepper evenly sprinkle the seasoning mix over both sides of tilapia.

Lightly drizzle fish with olive oil and top each piece with a dot of butter. Baked at 375°F for 20-25 min. If you want it to get a little browned around the edges, you can broil for 3-5 minutes at the end if desired.

Combine Taco sauce ingredients:

- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1/3 cup Mayo
- 2 Tbsp lime juice (from 1 medium lime)
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- 1 tsp Sriracha sauce

or to taste in a medium bowl or a large measuring cup and whisk together until well blended. Serve the sauce in a squeeze bottle.

To serve the tacos, toast quickly toast the corn tortillas on a large dry skillet or griddle over medium/high heat.

To assemble: start with the fish then add remaining ingredients finishing off with a generous sprinkle of cotija cheese and finally that awesome taco sauce! Serve with a fresh lime wedge to squeeze extra lime juice over tacos.



BROCCOLI-CHEESE CASSEROLE

1 (10.75 oz) can condensed cream of mushroom soup
1 cup mayonnaise
1 egg, beaten
¼ cup onions, chopped
3 (10 oz) pkg frozen chopped broccoli
8 oz shredded sharp Cheddar cheese salt and pepper to taste
1 dash paprika

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Butter a 9×13 inch baking dish.

In a medium mixing bowl, whisk together condensed soup, mayonnaise, egg and onions. Place frozen broccoli into a very large mixing bowl. (I like to use my large stainless steel bowl to mix this recipe thoroughly.) Break up the frozen broccoli. Using a rubber spatula, scrape soup-mayonnaise mixture on top of broccoli, and mix well. Sprinkle on cheese, and mix well. Spread mixture into prepared baking dish, and smooth top of casserole. Season with salt, pepper and paprika.

Bake for 45 minutes to 1 hour.

Chocolate Rice Krispie Balls

½ cup peanut butter
3 tbsps soft butter
1 tsp vanilla
1 cup Rice Krispies
½ cup chopped pecans



1 cup shredded coconut Mix together,refrigerate for a half hour and form into balls. Return to fridge and let chill at least an hour. Melt the following in a double –boiler:

1 package chocolate chips,

1 square sweet chocolate

Keep on low so that chocolate remains soft.

Drop balls into chocolate mixture one at a time using a fork to roll them so that the chocolate will cover. Let set on parchment paper in fridge.

The Famous Woolworth Ice Box Cheesecake

1 (12-oz) can Carnation evaporated milk, well chilled
1⅔ cups graham cracker crumbs
½ cup confectioners' sugar
6 tbl. margarine or butter, melted
1 (3-oz) box lemon Jell-O gelatin
1 cup boiling water
1 (8-oz) package cream cheese
1 cup granulated sugar

4 tbl. fresh lemon juice or 2 tsp. vanilla extract

Shake the can of evaporated milk and refrigerate until well chilled, at least an hour. In a small mixing bowl and using a wire whisk, dissolve the Jell-O in the boiling water, 1 to 2 minutes. Set aside to cool to lukewarm. Combine graham cracker crumbs, confectioners' sugar, and melted butter. Reserve 1/3 cup of the mixture for the topping. Press the remainder firmly into the bottom of an 11.5×7.5-inch or similar dish. Refrigerate or put in the freezer until needed.

In another large mixing bowl and using a mixer, beat together the cream cheese, granulated sugar, and lemon juice or vanilla until smooth and creamy. Beat in the cooled Jell-O until well blended. Refrigerate mixture for now. Shake the can of chilled evaporated milk again and pour into another large mixing bowl. Beat on high speed of mixer until light and fluffy, 3 to 4 minutes. It should have the consistency of beaten egg whites. Beat in the cream cheese/Jell-O mixture. Pour mixture over the chilled crust. Sprinkle top with the remaining crumb mixture. Refrigerate for several hours before cutting into squares. NOTE: You can use a larger pan, like 9×12-inch and the dessert will be thinner. If you have too much filling for the smaller pan, pour it into small bowls and refrigerate for a quick and creamy

snack.



Cloth Bags for Female patients at VA


Original cloth size: 44" x 12". Also need 37" yarn or heavy string and 2 buttons.

Iron cloth flat. Fold lengthwise with right sides facing and sew right side from top to bottom. Sew left side from bottom to 14 inches from the top; stop.

To create an opening on the left side, fold under remaining 7-8" on left side along seam line and sew each fold line from previous stopping point to the top on both sides of seam. Backstitch along the bottom split. $\begin{cases} 1 \\ 1 \end{cases}$

Fold top selvage down inside bag 2" all the way around the top from back left side to front left side; iron flat; do this again so there are two 2" folds. Iron flat. Sew the fold three times: 1/4" from top; 1" from top; 2" from top. Backstitch all ends.

Size should now be 18-18.5" long and 11" wide.



Use safety pin to pull 37" yarn or heavy string through middle casing line⁴ from left front to left back. Thread each end of yarn through a large button and tie end securely under each button. Sew 1/2" seam along bottom of bag for added strength and to shorten the length slightly. Finished!
